CSRO is dedicated to empowering rheumatologists and their practices with resources to proactively increase patient access to rheumatologic care and medication, and to improve the practice environment for rheumatologists in private practice.

STATE & FEDERAL ADVOCACY

The challenging health care environment greatly affects the way rheumatologists manage their practices. It can interfere with patient access to care and force rheumatologists to make difficult decisions. State legislatures are considering an increasing amount of legislation of impact to the rheumatologic community.

In response, rheumatologists must be engaged at both the state and federal levels to protect their patients and their livelihood. CSRO is at the forefront of state, federal, and payer policies working to grant access, affordability, and relief for the rheumatology community by focusing on nonpartisan education of legislators, government officials and the corporate community on the impact that policy and procedural changes may have to the patient's quality of care and disease management options.

CSRO also collaborates with patient organizations and other national societies to elevate awareness and provide a forum for an exchange of ideas, fostering a collaborative environment.

STATE SOCIETY SUPPORT

CSRO actively seeks opportunities to assist state and regional organizations to become formal societies. Through its efforts, CSRO has been instrumental in the founding and developing of a number of state societies. The organization also provides support to states looking to increase the activities and advocacy of current membership.

As an organization, it continues to work with states that have no active society and reaches out to more than 4,000 rheumatologists on the CSRO mailing list.

She presented 3 sessions on the 2021 E/M Documentation and Coding changes at the American College of Rheumatology's annual ACR Convergence conference in November 2020. She is a frequently sought after speaker as she possesses the unique perspective of avoiding risk and liability while optimizing reimbursement in the highly regulated health care industry.



Erin L. Arnold, MD, FACR

Dr. Arnold is a native of the North Shore of Chicago where she currently resides with her husband and two sons. Dr. Arnold received her medical degree from the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine, completed her residency

During her board membership she was involved in the ACR'S strategic planning meetings and task forces for "the ideal Rheumatology practice", Musculoskeletal Ultrasound, and leadership development fellowship. Dr. Arnold has also represented the ACR on the American College of Radiology's Imaging task force and has acted as the ACR liason for the Arthritis Foundation's Public Policy committee.

Dr. Arnold is founder and principal of Arnold Arthritis and Rheumatology . She is dedicated to providing innovative care to patients with arthritis in an optimistic, professional and compassionate environment. Dr. Arnold's approach to patient care emphasizes an aggressive approach to achieve remission of disease by incorporating multiple modalities (state of the art lab measurements, innovative imaging modalities and biologic therapy) to achieve this goal. She has developed a unique ultrasound exam accredited by the AIUM, to diagnose inflammatory and crystal induced arthritis and to follow the patient's response to therapy. Dr. Arnold is committed to providing timely access to Rheumatology care and has designed her practice around the principles of chronic disease management.



Herbert S. Baraf, MD, FACP, MACR

Dr. Baraf is founding member and former managing partner of Arthritis and Rheumatism Associates (ARA), one of the largest private rheumatology practices in the United States with 23 rheumatologists in seven locations. He holds academic

appointments as Clinical Professor of Medicine at George Washington University in Washington, DC, and Associate Clinical Professor at the University of Maryland in Baltimore.

He earned his medical degree from the State University of New York Downstate Medical Center in Brooklyn, New York, and completed his internship and residency at the George Washington University Hospital. Dr. Baraf did his fellowship training in rheumatology at Duke University in Durham, North Carolina.

Dr. Baraf has served on numerous committees of the American College of Rheumatology (ACR), contributing to programming for its annual meeting, helping to develop quality of care measures and, more recently, lobbying Congress for more rational payment systems for patient care. His efforts were instrumental in the ACR's development of freestanding musculoskeletal ultrasound courses for rheumatologists.

As the founder of the Center for Rheumatology and Bone Research, a division of his practice, Dr. Baraf has served as principal investigator on over 400 clinical trials of treatments for gout, rheumatoid arthritis, psoriatic arthritis, Sjögren's syndrome, and other disorders. He formerly served on the board of directors of the Sjögren's Foundation.

He is an author of more than 30 peer-reviewed papers and has presented his work at numerous national and international meetings. Dr. Baraf was named a Master of the ACR in 2012. In 2014 the ACR conferred upon him the Paulding Phelps Award for "for outstanding service to patients, community and the practice of medicine."



Kostas Botsoglou, MD

Dr. Botsoglou is a managing partner and founding member of the Rheumatology Center of Western New York in Cheektowaga, New York. He completed his residency at University at Buffalo School of Medicine and his Rheumatology fel-

lowship at Rutgers Robert Wood Johnson Medical School. Dr. Botsoglou has been a member of the Coalition of State Rheumatology's Board of Directors since 2016.



James M. Dahle, MD, FACEP

Gregory F. Schimizzi, MD

Born in Detroit , Micigan, Dr Gregory Schimizzi obtained undergraduate and medical school education at Wayne State University where he received Bachelor of Science and Medical degrees.

Dr. Schimizzi completed his internal medicine internship and residency at the Detroit Medical Center Affiliated Hospitals and trained in rheumatology / clinical Immunology at the University of California, Irvine. After completing his fellowship training, Dr. Schimizzi practiced rheumatology in metropolitan Detroit and then in Wilmington, North Carolina.

Dr. Schimizzi has been a practicing rheumatologist for over 40 years, cofounded Carolina Arthritis Associates in 1991, was an Associate Professor of Medicine at the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill and at New Hanover Coastal AHEC. He has been involved in advocating for access to care for rheumatology patients in North Carolina and across the country. He is responsible for restarting the North Carolina Rheumatology Society (NCRA), which is now the third largest state society in the United States and was president of the NCRA for three years.

Dr. Schimizzi also cofounded the Coalition of State Rheumatology Organizations (CSRO) in 2003, which is now comprised of more 30 state and regional rheumatology professional societies whose mission is to advocate for excellence in Rheumatology Care and ensuring access to the highest quality care for the management of rheumatologic diseases. He and the other CSRO directors formed the National Organization of Rheumatology Managers to assist rheumatology practice executives in day-to-day management problems specific to the specialty.

As past president and a long time Director of the CSRO, Dr. Schimizzi has had the opportunity to speak or testify before the Food and Drug Administration (FDA), Health and Human Services (HHS) / Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS), Congressional Committees and Medicare Payment Advisory Committee (MEDPAC). Dr. Schimizzi, together with other CSRO Directors, was influential in informing Congressional Committee Staff of the importance of Rheumatology patient access to care during the writing of the Medicare Modernization Act of 2003. He retired from the CSRO in 2020.

Dr. Schimizzi is Board Certified in Internal Medicine and Rheumatology. His other interests include carpentry, hunting, photography and music.



Grace C. Wright MD, PhD, FACR

Dr. Wright is a rheumatologist in private practice in New York City. She earned her undergraduate degree, magna cum laude, from Barnard College and her medical and doctorate degrees at the NYU School of Medicine. She then completed an in-
